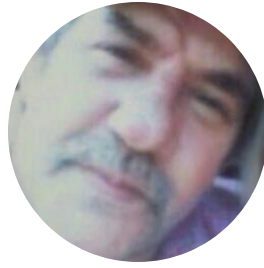

He was 53 years old. Robin was born on July 24th, 1962 in Mobile, Alabama at Mobile City Hospital. He was a member of the Army National Guard, and was the third son of Afton Jeannette Gilley and Arthur Pete Kelly. He is survived by Afton and Pete, and was the middle of seven siblings.
