One of Christ's dearest angels, Lydia Cuellar Zammit was called home on Friday, December 29, 2023, at the age of 86. 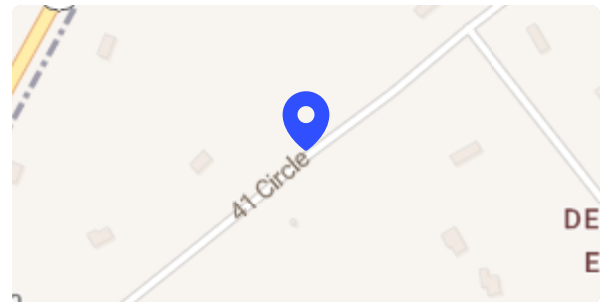

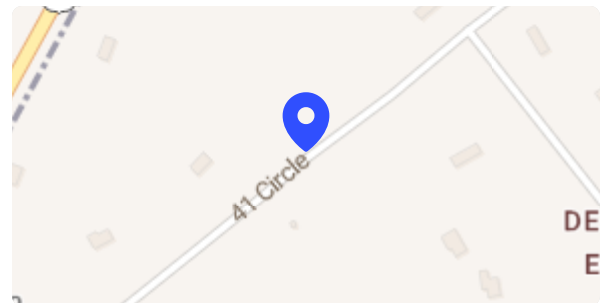
